One-Pager <u>Written</u> Requirements

- Include the title of the text you're responding to, the author's name and the genre somewhere on the page where the reader will notice it.
- All Drawings, designs and themes should represent themes, characters, conflict, and/or the setting of text.
- Include a border. This can include words, pictures, symbols, or quotes from the text. Fill the paper to the edges.
- Include 2-3 notable quotes, phrases or passages that are important to the understanding of the text.
 Include quotation marks.
- Draw/Create/Paste at least 3 images that stand out. These can be 3D images as well.
- Write 2-3 personal statements or connections about what you have read. These are not simple opinions or book review type statements. (Ex: NOT this: "I can relate to the main character feeling lost, because I've been lost before." But LIKE this: "I can relate to the main character feeling lost in the text because it reminded me of when I got to middle school and didn't know where anything was. I was nervous and afraid to ask for help.")
- Write and answer 1 FAT question. (Use Skinny vs. Fat Question guide on back of paper to help.)
- Include at least 1 signpost you found and explain why it is important (use bookmark questions and digging deeper on back of paper).


One-Pager <u>Visual</u> Requirements


- Use a lot of color, patterns, texture, writing styles, photographs, paintings, etc., to illustrate your thoughts and ideas clearly and creatively.
- Be neat, but your ENTIRE PAGE should be filled, no space should be blank or left in pencil. If you have extra room, repeat any of the above steps/elements.
- Your full name goes on the BACK of the one-pager.

Your paper should be colorful and meaningful. Here's your chance to go as creative as your mind can wander!
